Grammar: Adjectives and Adverbs

★ *Adjectives* are words used to describe nouns, such as people, places, animals, or things. *Adverbs* describe verbs, adjectives, and other adverbs. Many adverbs end with *ly*.

Adjectives describe nouns

Example: I like to read in a quiet room.

Adverbs describe verbs

Example: He speaks slowly.
