

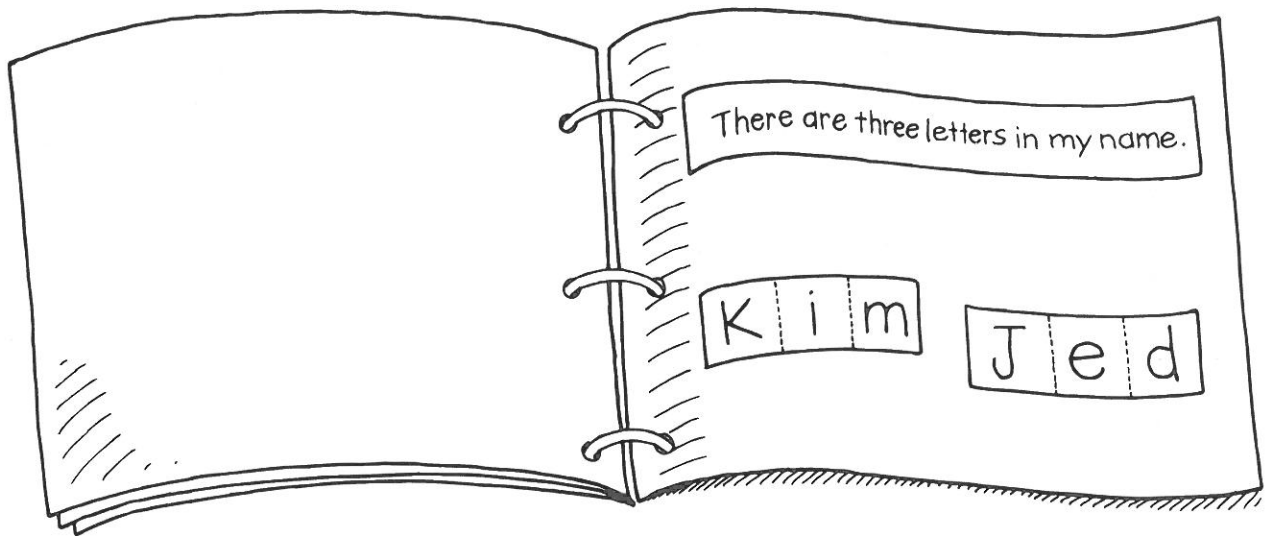
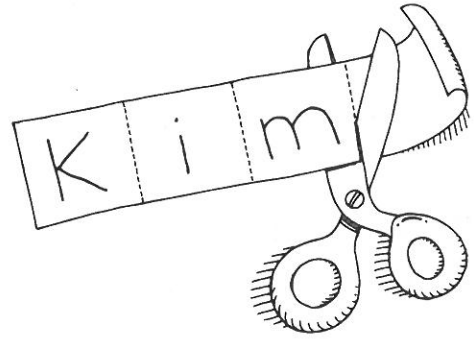
How Many Letters Are in Your Name?



Materials

- ✓ Page Titles reproducible (page 31)
- ✓ Name Strips reproducible (page 32)
- ✓ scissors
- ✓ glue
- ✓ construction paper

Copy and cut apart a Page Titles reproducible. Glue each title to the top of a piece of construction paper. Write *How Many Letters Are in Your Name?* on another sheet of construction paper to create a book cover. Make several copies of the Name Strips reproducible, and cut them apart. Give each child a name strip that has enough boxes for the letters in his or her name. (Children with long names may need two strips glued together.) Ask children to write one letter of their name in each box. Have them cut off the empty boxes. Place the construction paper pages and several bottles of glue on a table. Encourage children to count the number of letters in their name and glue their name strip to the corresponding page. For example, a child named Kim would glue her name strip to the page titled "There are three letters in my name." Let the pages dry. Laminate each page and the cover, and combine them to create a class book. Place the book in your classroom library for children to enjoy.
