Varied Reading Selections

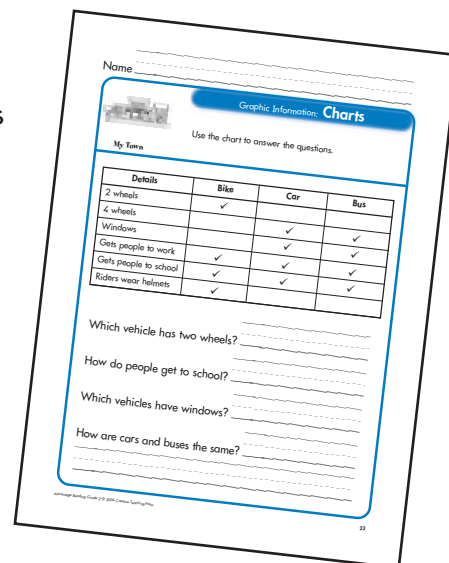
Fiction and Nonfiction

Meaningful reading experiences are offered across a **variety of reading genres**. Each story selection builds on high-frequency words, content vocabulary, and skills introduced in the section. The reading selection at the end of each unit can be removed from the workbook and folded into a mini-book.



Graphic Information

Graphic information reading selections include charts, graphs, labels, maps, and recipes. These types of reading opportunities help students hone **real-life reading** skills.

High-Frequency Words

A word list is included for an overview of the words a student should easily recognize at each grade level and that are used in the reading selections throughout the workbook. For extra practice, prepare flashcards of the words on the list for students to practice recognizing and reading quickly. This will help students develop a solid bank of **sight words on which they can rely and that are automatic.**

Fluency Practice

Reading fluency is the ability to **read with expression**, intonation, and a natural flow that sounds like talking. Fluency is essential for comprehension because the lack of it results in choppy, robotic reading that stands in the way of making sense out of a phrase or sentence.

Writing

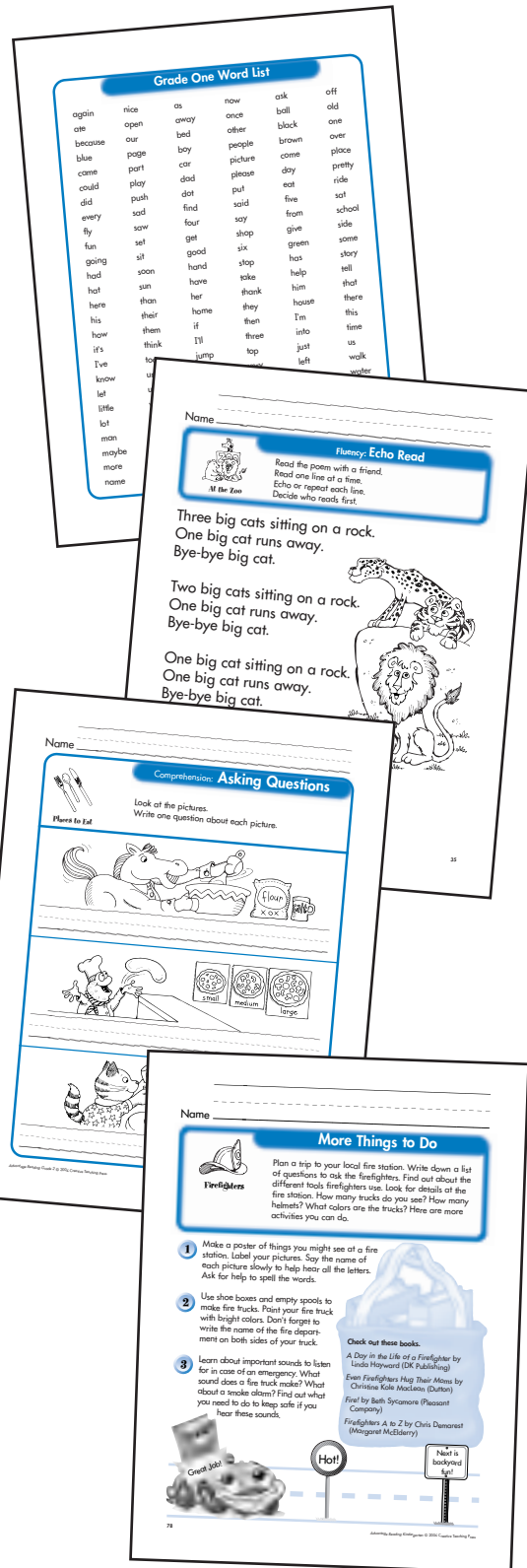
Reading and writing are partner skills. Students are given opportunities to transfer their newly learned reading skills to **authentic writing** opportunities.

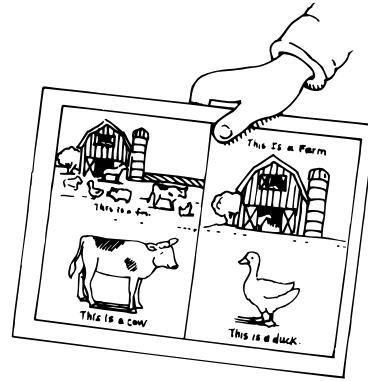

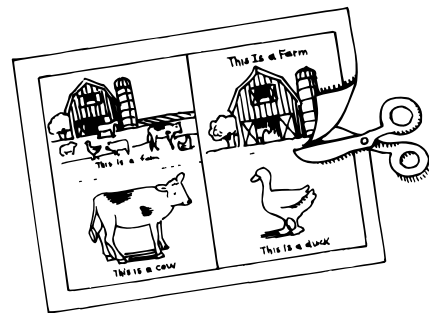

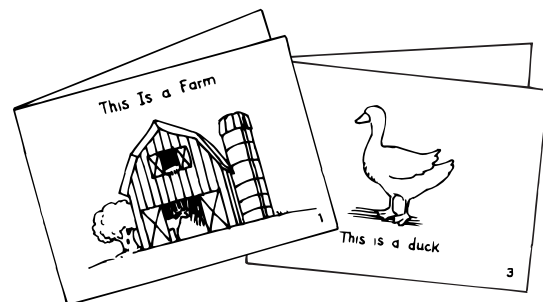
1 Tear out the page.



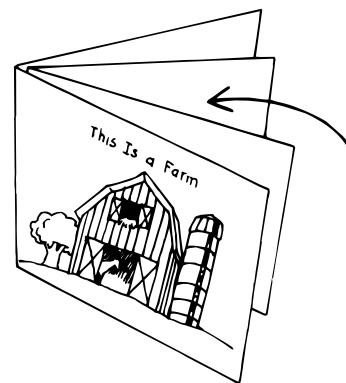
2 Cut along the dotted line.
